

**LIBERTARIAN U.S. SENATE CANDIDATE
BUCKLEY COMMENTS ON PORK DIFFERENCE
BETWEEN SENATOR CHAMBLISS AND JOHN McCAIN**

Atlanta, Georgia – September 5, 2008

Senator John McCain has a different view of pork, including farm subsidies and other waste, than U.S. Senator Saxby Chambliss. McCain is on record as being against wasteful spending. In contrast, Senator Chambliss has voted against a bill that would have limited farm subsidies to full-time farmers making less than \$750,000 per year, and has expressed pride in his pork attainment efforts.

In a July 25, 2008 article by Julia Malone and Scott Girard of *The Atlanta Journal-Constitution*, Mr. Chambliss criticized Georgia House of Representatives members Linder, Broun, Deal, Price and Westmoreland for taking a no pork pledge.

Allen Buckley, the Libertarian Party's U.S. Senate candidate, said: "Mr. Chambliss is more like a Democrat than a traditional Republican, in terms of fiscal discipline. His record places him at odds with Mr. McCain. If elected, I'll immediately act to solve Social Security's problems, reasonably reduce other entitlements and eliminate all other spending not necessary to run the federal government."
